

Flood mitigation scheme – then and now

- Brief history
 - West End field was identified as an optimum site for an engineered flood attenuation scheme
 - 2/3rds of water flow into the village is from the West End
 - 1/3rd comes from the South.
- Where are we now.
 - NFM will help but will not prevent flooding
 - EA funding will not allow an engineered scheme in the village unless Michael Payne MP is able to make an exception for us.

Impact of further development

- Severn Trent Water
- Notts County Council / Environment Agency





Sewer capacity

- Our sewers flood with existing homes before the road floods.
- More houses will require increase in sewerage capacity
- Another indication of sewer issues are if your toilet levels change during a flood. PLEASE REPORT THIS

Drainage

West End site

- Collects 2/3rds of the run off water that reaches Main Street
- Land available for development has been identified as the optimum site for an engineered flood scheme

Shelt Hill site

- This is the direction that the water leaves the village and we must ensure that it is not held back in the village.
- If you have evidence of where flood plains are, please share these with Gedling Borough Council.

Planning considerations that count

- Road safety
- Protection of conservation areas and heritage assets
- Flooding issues
- Impact on community
- Lack of infrastructure including shops/schools, roads, internet, library, bank etc etc.
- There are more suitable alternative sites in Gedling.
- Green belt area / protect wildlife habitat
